We have had a lovely return to school for Summer 2 in Ash Class!

Firstly, swimming and rehearsals are now in full swing! The children all enjoyed their first session at Bovey Tracey Pool and our first run through of *Robin Hood and the Sherwood Hoodies*! Any support you can offer the children with learning their lines is greatly appreciated.

In Maths, we have been exploring angles. The children have been learning about angles around a point, angles on a straight line and vertically opposite angles.

In English, we have begun learning about our new text *Flood*. We have been exploring the different emotions the characters feel at different points in the story and what adventurous vocabulary choices we can use to describe them.

In Science, we have started our unit on Earth and Space. The children learnt the order of the planets in our solar system and then chose their own research questions surrounding the topic.

It's been a lovely start to the final half term of the year and this Friday we thoroughly enjoyed our celebration of the week with our Friday Funk!


The children have been very cheery and motivated and working hard.

English and Maths



In English, we have been familiarising ourselves with our new text on Paddington and the children have been discussing their favourite qualities about Paddington and learning a new story.

In Maths, we have been completed elicitation tasks for Arithmetic and our new unit on time and Friday we completed our first telling the time lesson. Reading the time to 5 minutes. The children really tried hard and did really hard in what is a challenging concept.

In Science, we have completed our unit on plant nutrition and reproduction. We have learnt how flowers rely on pollinators in order to reproduce and how plants disperse their seeds through different methods to ensure their survival.

We then completed our end of unit assessment.

We have started our new unit in Geography where we continue our learning on the interconnected world and this week we were focusing on 6 and 4 figure compass points.
